Learning objectives

Levels of exploitation of some animal and plant species are high and the trade in them, together with other factors, such as habitat loss, is capable of heavily depleting their populations and even bringing some species close to extinction.

Many wildlife species in trade are not endangered, but the existence of an agreement to ensure the sustainability of the trade is important in order to safeguard these resources for the future.

This course introduces you to the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES), which is an international agreement to ensure that international trade in specimens of wild animals and plants does not threaten their survival.

At the end of this course, you will be able to:

- 1. Describe the core components and mechanisms established by the Convention;
- 2. Explain the three Appendices of the Convention.

Content and duration

This online course is comprised of 5 lessons, which provide relevant information about the different aspects of the Convention. The lessons are organized in interactive modules that combine the course theory with exercises and interactions that will facilitate the learning process.
