## Introductory Course to the to the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety





### **Course Syllabus**

### Learning Objectives

The Convention on Biological Diversity provided for Parties to consider the need for and modalities of a protocol setting out appropriate procedures for the safe transfer, handling and use of any Living Modified Organisms (LMOs) resulting from biotechnology that may have adverse effect on the conservation and sustainable use of biological diversity.

This course introduces you to the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety to the Convention on Biological Diversity. In regulating the international movement of LMOs, the Protocol seeks to prevent or mitigate risk by requiring that exporters obtain the importing country's advance informed agreement before the LMOs are introduced into the importer's environment.

At the end of this course, you will be able to:

- 1. Explain the benefits and risks of LMOs, and the importance of ensuring their safe transfer, handling and use.
- 2. Identify the core components and mechanisms of the Cartagena Protocol and Nagoya-Kuala Lumpur Supplementary Protocol.

# Content & Duration

This online course is composed of 4 lessons which are organized in interactive modules that combine course theory with exercises and interactions to facilitate the learning process. The core content of the lessons is complemented with references to primary sources and additional resources on external websites.
