Course outline and learning objectives

International travel and trade are greater than ever before. As people & commodities move around the world, organisms that present risks to plants travel with them. Sudden introduction of exotic pests into places where they were not present before can cause a severe food crisis and important economic and ecological damage.

This course introduces you to the International Plant Protection Convention (IPPC), an international plant health agreement that aims to protect cultivated and wild plants by preventing the introduction and spread of pests by setting international standards to harmonize phytosanitary measures that would facilitate safe international trade

At the end on the course, you will be able to:

1. Explain the impact of pests and diseases to the environment, livelihoods and food security
2. Describe the core components and mechanisms of the IPPC

Content and duration

The course is comprised of 4 short units. Each unit includes an interactive module and a pdf hand-out with links to the relevant terms of the InforMEA glossary, videos and additional reading materials.

It will take you around 2 hours to complete the course, excluding additional training materials. At the end of the course, take a quiz to test your knowledge.

Assessment and certificate

Take the quiz at the end of the course to assess your learning progress. There are 10 questions in the course, which will change if you take a second attempt to pass the quiz.

You are required to answer at least 80% of the assessment questions correctly in order to obtain a course certificate.
